The goal of the Children's Nature Retreat, which is located south of Descanso on Japatul Spur Road, is to give all children access to animals, nature and the environment.

We believe that the experience at the Children's Nature Retreat will have a profound and positive impact on children, often reducing stress levels while offering a sense of connection to the earth."

I had the opportunity to take my two grandnieces there recently, toddlers who live in El Cajon. Even though very young, they found tremendous joy in not only seeing the animals,

but in being able to help feed them. Despite having relatives in Descanso, they have had very little experience with goats, horses and piggies. But beyond the standard ranch animals, the Children's Nature Retreat takes in more exotic animals in need of a caring environment. The girls delighted in feeding zebras and camels.



Fall hours are from 10 am to 4 pm, with later hours in late spring through summer. They are located at 5178 Japatul Spur in Alpine, just eight miles south of Descanso.
